





.I enlisted in U.S. Air Force in April of 2003; I did my basic training at Lockland AFB in San Antonio, Texas. I engaged in double Technical Training schools to become a medic. The first school was at Lackland AFB in San Antonio, Texas for twelve weeks and the second school was at Sheppard AFB in Wichita Falls, Texas for six weeks.

With the Military's assistance I have recently received my bachelor's degree in Technology Management. I have been offered the opportunity to receive an early commission by transferring to a new unit in the medical field. I begin school in January in pursuit of my medical degree.
